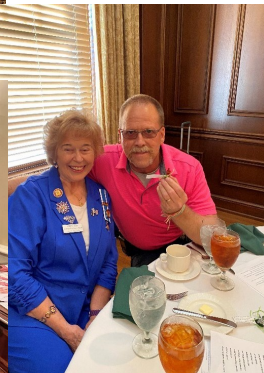

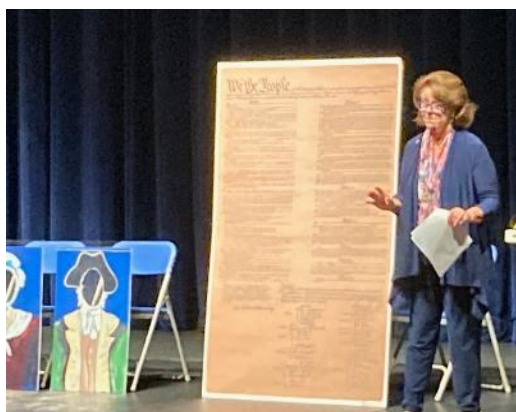

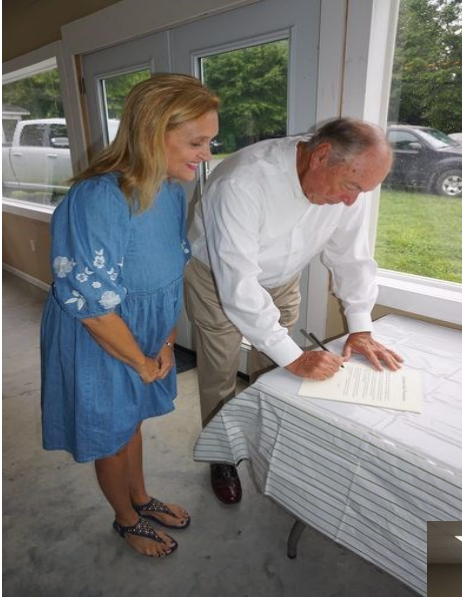

Then sign up and take the Committee Leaders Course!

Learn what it takes to be a more effective committee leader whether you were asked to be a chapter, state, division vice, national vice, or national chair. This course has you covered!

The Committee Leaders Course is a state-sponsored and NSDAR-supported activity and is designed to fit into anyone's busy schedule through online self-directed learning. The Committee Leaders Course is open to any DAR member in good standing who has completed the Members Course* and has a current subscription to American Spirit Magazine. The course has three parts: complete 17 modules that build on one another; deep dive study and complete workbooks for three different committees; plan an event using the knowledge gained. The event does NOT need to be executed, only planned for.
